### **Objects Of the TAOL Article II**

- 1:** To encourage, promote, aid in and effect the interchange of data, information, experience, ideas, knowledge, methods and techniques, voluntarily among members of TAOL, relating to the field of locksmithing;
- 2:** To elevate the position of those engaged in installing and servicing Security and Access Control Hardware in all its branches and to establish a standard of qualification for membership;
- 3:** To work with the manufacturers and distributors of Security and Access Control Hardware toward a sympathetic understanding of our mutual problems to the best interest of all individuals in the security industry;
- 4:** To provide guest speakers who shall be qualified to give technical or other information that is useful or of interest to locksmiths;
- 5:** To collect monies by way of dues or otherwise and to hold and extend the same in furtherance of the objects of TAOL;
- 6:** To establish a uniform Code of Ethics and to promote and maintain friendly co-operation among all locksmiths endeavouring to advance their mutual interests;
- 7:** To co-operate with all organizations related to security;
- 8:** To promote the recognition of locksmithing as a separate trade;
- 9:** To promote and develop an apprenticeship program for the training of locksmiths; and
- 10:** TAOL shall also have as such objectives not inconsistent with the foregoing as may from time to time be formulated and announced by the Board of Directors and approved by the membership at a meeting so called for this purpose.

### **TAOL Code of Ethics Article IV**

- 1:** That the dignity of his/her chosen profession may be perpetuated, it is the duty of each member of TAOL by his/her acceptance and continuance of membership therein shall be deemed to have subscribed to the following Code of Ethics. As a Professional Locksmith, I agree and promise,
  - a:** to pursue my professional work in the spirit of fairness to my client, with fidelity to security in conformance with appropriateness and with high ideals of personal honour;
  - b:** to properly and impartially analyze security problems receiving my attention and to advance the best possible solution for the protection of my client;
  - c:** to conduct myself in a dignified manner, to avoid using any improper or questionable methods of soliciting professional work;
  - d:** to refrain from associating myself with or allowing the use of my name by any enterprise of questionable character, or in any manner countenancing misrepresentation or disrepute in the trade;
  - e:** to co-operate in advancing the best interest of the locksmithing industry by interchange of general information and experience with my fellow locksmith; and
  - f:** to encourage and promote loyalty for my profession and interest myself in public welfare, always ready to apply my special knowledge, skill and training for the advancement of my profession.

#### **By-Laws Pertaining To Membership in TAOL Article V**

Classes of membership are defined as follows;

**ACTIVE** - an individual who is gainfully employed in the locksmith industry, either self-employed or as an employee, servicing and/or installing security products and has served in this manner for a period of not less than three (3) years. An active member is eligible to hold office and has the right to vote.

**INSTITUTIONAL** - an individual who is gainfully employed in the locksmith industry, servicing and/or installing security products for an end-user facility, (the end facility user may be a college, university, hospital, governmental agency, business, or corporation etc.) and has served in this manner for a period of not less than three (3) years. An Institutional member is eligible to hold office and has the right to vote.

**APPRENTICE** - an individual who meets all the requirements of an active member except for the three (3) year period of service. An apprentice member is not eligible to hold office but has the right to vote.

**STUDENT** - an individual who is actively participating in locksmithing training courses, but because of current employment/experience does not meet the requirements for active or apprentice. A student member is not eligible to hold office and does not have the right to vote.

**ALLIED** - an individual who is gainfully employed in sales of security products, sales and service of alarm systems and law enforcement. An allied member is not eligible to hold office and does not have the right to vote.

**ASSOCIATE** - a manufacturer, company or distributor engaged in supplying security hardware and accessories to the locksmithing, security and safe industry. An associate member is eligible to hold office, excluding President and Vice-President. Associate members holding office shall be limited to a maximum of two (2) members. An associate member has the right to vote.

**HONOURARY** - a member who has rendered outstanding service, and proposed by three (3) members in good standing for honorary membership, to the Board of Directors in writing for approval of the Board. Upon approval by the Board, the proposal is submitted to the General Members at an Annual Meeting. An honorary member is not eligible to hold office and does not have the right to vote. An honorary member is not required to pay dues.

**LIFE** - life membership is the highest honour that is bestowed by TAOL to those individuals that displayed a distinctive role in services to The Association. Nomination, together with a list of achievements and number of years of service, is presented to the Secretary in writing sixty (60) days prior to the Annual Meeting. The nomination must receive approval by a minimum of five (5) of the Board of Directors. Approval at the Annual Meeting is by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of eligible members.
